EXHIBITION FACT SHEET

Description:

Discover how Abraham Lincoln's changing views toward slavery transformed America. The exhibition explores this powerful story through five of Lincoln's key speeches: A House Divided, 1858; his first inaugural address, 1861; the Gettysburg Address, 1863; his second inaugural address, March 1865; and the speech on Reconstruction, April 1865, given three days before his assassination.

"Lincoln's Undying Words" is presented in partnership with the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum in Springfield, Illinois. This exhibition includes artifacts from the Chicago History Museum's renowned John and Jeanne Rowe Abraham and Mary Todd Lincoln Collection. Educational programs for Undying Words are sponsored by the Efroymson Family Fund; the exhibition's corporate sponsor is Wintrust.
